


Rainfall at Shellwood Hill - *George Arnison*

Trustee role – Almshouses Charity – Ivybridge, Devon

The Eden Cottages Trust is a charity which owns and runs a row of almshouses in Ivybridge, Devon, comprising two houses and four flats, gardens and grounds. The Trust was established in 1927 and requires that the residents and a majority of the trustees be members of the Church of England.

There are currently six trustees who together bring experience of finance, investments, building maintenance, charity work and the law. One of them now wishes to retire so the Trust is looking to appoint another trustee.

The role is a voluntary one so no remuneration is payable. Trustees meet formally not less than three times a year in Ivybridge with ad hoc meetings arranged as required. The day to day business affairs of the trust are handled by the trust's Clerk and Visitor (a part-time employee) and its Honorary Treasurer (one of the trustees).

Beryl's Bookworms – Katie Lloyd

The Tattooist of Auschwitz is a love story that took place in the unlikely of places.

Heather Morris spent 3 years talking to Lale Sokolov, a Slovakian Jew, who in 1942 was tasked with permanently tattooing identification numbers on his fellow prisoners. Imprisoned for more than two and a half years, Lale witnesses horrific atrocities and barbarism but also incredible acts of bravery and compassion.

He tattoos the number 32407 on a young Slovakian lady named Gita and in those few minutes he falls completely in love with her.

The story of this couple is a testament to the endurance of love and humanity under the darkest possible conditions.

The group listened to a clip of Lale talking before he died, aged 88, who finishes by saying 'I tattooed her number onto her left arm and she tattooed her number on to my heart'.

The discussion explored how the writer had taken Lale's memories and experiences, and created an important and immensely moving memoir, and, although some of the group felt that the writer's style was a little simplistic at times, we agreed it was a book that was difficult to put down, once started.

The discussion we had covered the incomprehensible evil of the concentration camps where Lale and Gita's hope and courage stood out.

We rated the book 4/5.

Our next book is 'The Salt Path' by Raynor Winn.





Your Stars Tonight In the few clear nights we have had in the last month I have been adjusting to the eternal spinning of the celestial sphere which brings in the Spring star constellations. It's good bye to Orion and his faithful dog Canis Major, for now the Leo and Virgo constellations are centre stage in the late evening southern sky. Over the last few years I have learnt to

recognise Leo with its lion's mane and body – it looks very Trafalgar Square. But Virgo is an undistinguished scattering of stars – although the inhabitants of any of the planets around them no doubt think the same about us. But what it lacks in stars, it makes up for in galaxies. For this is the “Realm of Galaxies” where we can peer through a porthole in the interstellar dust and billions of stars of our own galaxy and see into the furthest parts of the universe.

As a child I was captivated by a photograph of these far distant galaxies and in particular the Markarian Chain. This is a tendril of faint galaxies which make a graceful curve and is part of the Virgo Super Cluster. At this point we have to get our heads around some big numbers - in fact - mind boggling numbers. The light from these galaxies left home over 50 million years ago – so wave “Hello” to them and they will see you another 50 million years in the future. (That's a promise.) Our own Milky Way galaxy is a relatively low ranked player in the universe with around 100 billion stars. We, in turn are a member of a small group of galaxies including the “nearby” Andromeda galaxy which is 2 million light years away. In turn that is part of the Virgo Super Cluster totalling thousands of galaxies – a bit like Augustus De Morgan's:

Big fleas have little fleas upon their backs to bite 'em,

And little fleas have lesser fleas, and so, ad infinitum.

But now there is evidence that we are all part of an even larger group of galaxies centred on the Norma Cluster (no doubt in honour of the esteemed Parish Newsletter editor) which is in turn part of an even larger Laniakea super cluster – so we are part of a family of perhaps 100,000 galaxies each containing billions of stars.

Recently I took a photograph of this area of the heavens. At first I was a bit disappointed as the stars seemed fuzzy and out of focus – and then I realised they were not stars but galaxies. There were hundreds of them - all shapes and sizes. Some were soft oval globes of light, but many were discs of stars like our own Milky Way galaxy is thought to be. Some were showing their full face towards us and look like celestial spinning Catherine Wheels, or whirlpools, while others were edge, on giving thin silvery slivers of light.

I tried to identify them from an astronomical atlas and was literally lost in space until I managed to spot a couple of colliding galaxies that go by the name of the Siamese Twins. From there I was able to navigate to the M 84 and M 86 galaxies (nicknamed “The Eyes” as they do have a slightly alarming appearance through the telescope) and then onwards to Markarian's Chain. By strange coincidence, in the centre of my photograph was the M 87 – which was head line news on the same day – for it is the galaxy containing the Black Hole which has swallowed the equivalent of 6 billion suns and was imaged for the first time a couple of weeks ago.

We have grown so much in the last 5 years and one very healthy off shoot has been the fund raising we have as a community managed to sustain.

South West Ambulance First Responders is a service that I know many of us have used in the parish. The charity trust has volunteers who support our local community by attending emergency calls ahead of an ambulance. Sometimes the difference is providing reassurance prior to the arrival of an ambulance; sometimes it is saving someone's life. It is a pleasure to be able to raise much needed funds for a service that helps members of our local community in their time of need.

The 2nd Charity is our local Citizen's Advice. They give people the knowledge and confidence they need to find their way forward, whoever they are and whatever their problem. It offers confidential advice on line, over the phone and in person for free. They can do this by a bank of volunteers and fund raising.

The April Parish Council Meeting started with renewed complaints about inconsiderate parking on the pavement along Fore Street, Ugborough – which is very inconvenient to pedestrians, particularly those with young children or pushing buggies. Also, on-street parking opposite the Horse & Groom, Bittaford is obscuring visibility at the junction with the Ugborough Road. So the Clerk is reporting them to the Police.

The Annual Parish Meeting was held in Bittaford and started with a fascinating presentation by Janie Moor of Citizens Advice South Hams. Did you know that it is a local independent charity, franchised from the National Citizens Advice? It relies on local funding and has a small team of paid staff and 64 volunteers. The key enquiry areas relate to welfare benefit and debt issues. Over the last year, there has been a 30% increase in debt enquiries and Citizens Advice had achieved £1.2m financial gains within the South Hams. It also provides specialist energy advice, can point people in the right direction e.g. where there is domestic violence, and campaigns on social policy issues, such as Universal Credit.

encourages you to get involved by using the services, or volunteering, with 12 weeks training, or fundraising, including 'Raise a Cuppa' 80th Anniversary events.

Wrangaton was the focus of attention at the Annual Parish Meeting, as residents complained about the recent parking restrictions and submitted a petition of 17 objectors. County Cllr Hosking has now met the residents onsite, and the double yellow lines at the junction between the B3213 and Green Lane may be replaced by a hatched area. In addition, the National Cycle Network along the B3213 and Shute Lane will be extinguished, but would continue along Wrangaton Road between Bittaford and Wrangaton.

More obstacles seem to have been put in the way of recognising Wrangaton as a settlement. It has not been recognised in the recently adopted Joint Local Plan and is unlikely to be included in the Dartmoor Local Plan Review. This is despite the 36 dwellings and shop/community space already approved and planning application for 5 dwellings in the pipeline.

The Parish Council election is being held on 2nd May, and it is likely that there will be changes in Councillors. The new Parish Councillors will formally be accepting their office at the Annual Parish Council Meeting, which is to be held on 8th May.

- Advertisement consent for 3 non-illuminated signs (part-retrospective) at Land at SX 648 564, adj Rutt Lane, Ivybridge Ref 0704/19/ADV Wainhomes South West **Neutral**
- Erection of single storey extension at Grove Villa, Bittaford Ref 0123/19 **Neutral**.

Prefer a more traditional construction

A Parish Map is to be designed for the Parish, showing roads, footpaths, pictures and views in the Parish. Copies of the map will be displayed in public places and offered for sale. Funding for the Map was granted to the Parish Council about 18 years ago, so it is high time this project moved forward! The next step is to find someone to design the map, and the Parish Council has already identified a couple of artists. If you know of anyone, do let us know.

Are you Throwing Away a fortune? SHDC advice is that putting the wrong items into your clear and blue sacks is costing a fortune as the offending items have to be removed before recycling can take place. The problem is costing South Hams District Council around £10,000 every month, effectively throwing away money.

It is asking residents to take a closer look at the list of items that can and cannot be recycled. The top offenders include pizza boxes, crisp packets, black plastic trays, food and unwashed tins and bottles.

The next Parish Council Meeting will be held a week later than usual, on Wednesday 8th May, starting at 7 p.m. with the Annual Parish Council Meeting. Agenda and minutes will be displayed on the noticeboards and website.

A letter from our Rector- Rev'd David Sayle

“We seek to unite our Mission Community, through Christ, in faith, hope and love”

This is the proposed new vision statement for our Three Rivers Mission Community. These words arrived from a Saturday morning (16th February) Vision Day for our Benefice when members of our church congregations and parishes to met together to think about how we work together as a new Benefice and how our combined mission can have an impact upon our parishes.

The morning was led by Sam Upham, the Diocesan Mission Enabler for the Totnes Archdeaconry and, following requests from our previous meeting, I quietly made tea and refreshments whilst everybody else was able to take a full part in the morning.

The meeting not only provided suggestions for our new Mission Statement, but also looked under the Diocesan Mission headings of Prayer and Worship, Discipleship and Serve, how we as a community of faith best express our belief and faith in God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

These were the most popular suggestions under the above headings and will now form the Mission Community's aims for the next twelve months.

Prayer and Worship

- **To introduce a 5th Sunday of the month Benefice Service.**
- **To develop intercessions within our Mission Community Services**
by training, guidance and the use of prayer boards within our Churches.

Discipleship

- **To develop Midweek Eucharistic Services, Bible Study and Prayer Groups.**
- **Increase the variety of Services available across our Mission Community Serve**
- **To streamline organisational and communicational structures across our Mission Community**
- **To develop Social events across our Mission Community**
- **To consider the introduction of a Mission Community Junior Choir.**

On top of all the above and after carefully consideration with the Diocesan Mission Enabler it was agreed to add the following to our Mission Community aims, to consider introducing a **Pastoral Care / Visiting Team** for our Mission Community.

By the time you receive your copy of the Parish Newsletter each of the seven churches would have held their Annual Parish Meetings and these aims and suggestions would have discussed. When Jebbeh's sister Fatmata went in to labour, there were so few ambulances that Fatmata had no choice but to walk for three hours under the baking sun, to the nearest hospital. The journey was long and with every step Fatmata struggled to keep walking. Jebbeh told us: 'My sister was crying out with hunger. She died on the side of the road. She never gave birth.'
